Tideland Creature Observation Class was held.

On Sunday, June 20, 2021 at the Shinkawa estuary tideland in Takamatsu City and Aji Marine Station, we held a nature observation experience class "Takamatsu Tideland Creature Observation class".

This observation class is an environmental learning course for citizens sponsored by the Takamatsu City Environment Bureau / Environmental Conservation Promotion Division, and was held for elementary and junior high school students and their parents.

On the class, Professor Ichimi and University students served the class as lecturers, and they learned what kind of creatures live in what kind of place on the tideland through collecting and observing.
